DAY CAMP SCHEDULE (T.K. and Kindergarten)

Monday - Friday June 1, 2026 - July 31, 2026

Each week, children will explore a new theme through engaging activities, hands-on projects, outdoor play, and interactive storytelling. These camps are designed to spark curiosity, creativity, and learning in a fun and nurturing environment.

WEEK 1: Tiny Explorers - World of Mini Beasts

In this exciting week, our tiny explorers will dive into the fascinating world of mini beasts as they observe ladybugs, ants, bees, worms, and snails up close using real magnifying glasses. Children will go on safe outdoor bug hunts, discover how insects move, explore their habitats, and learn simple science facts through hands-on play. This camp builds observation skills, curiosity, and confidence as kids explore nature in a fun, gentle way.

WEEK 2: Rainbow Science Week - Colors in Motion

Kids will become little scientists as they experiment with color mixing using water, droppers, and food coloring to create magical rainbow changes before their eyes. Through hands-on activities, children will explore cause and effect, practice fine-motor skills, and learn basic science concepts in the most colorful, exciting way possible. Every day is a new rainbow discovery!

WEEK 3: Little Chefs Cooking Camp - Tasty Creations & Early Kitchen Skills

Our little chefs will enjoy making adorable no-heat recipes like fruit kabobs, veggie faces, and yogurt parfaits while learning early cooking and nutrition skills. Along the way, children build real math skills—measuring ingredients, counting scoops, and comparing sizes—all through joyful, edible creations. This camp boosts independence, creativity, and healthy eating habits.

WEEK 4: STEM Builders Camp - Towers, Bridges & Big Ideas

In this hands-on building adventure, children will design and build using blocks, magnetic tiles, cups, cardboard, and tubes while completing exciting STEM challenges like building the tallest tower, the strongest bridge, and the fastest ramp racers. Through teamwork and problem-solving, kids strengthen early engineering skills, creativity, and confidence—all while having a blast constructing their own ideas.

WEEK 5: Dino Discovery Land: Fossils, Footprints & Volcano Adventures

Young paleontologists will journey back in time as they dig for dinosaur bones in a sensory bin, make salt-dough fossils, and create dinosaur footprints. They'll explore real science concepts through thrilling activities like erupting volcano experiments and learning how dinosaurs lived long ago. This camp fuels imagination, curiosity, and a love for science through big dino fun!

WEEK 6: Space Explorers: Beyond the Galaxy

Young astronauts will embark on a thrilling mission through space as they engineer paper rockets, test launch angles, and explore early physics concepts like force and motion. Children will investigate a moon-sand sensory station filled with astronauts, rovers, and craters while practicing scientific observation skills. Inside our glow-in-the-dark "Star Tent," campers will experience stargazing as they learn about constellations, planets, and what makes our universe so magical.

WEEK 7: Animal Habitats Adventure: Science of Where Animals Live

Campers travel across the world through hands-on exploration of the Arctic, Jungle, Desert, and Forest habitats. Each environment comes to life through themed sensory bins—snow, sand, leaves, rocks, and water—where children investigate climates, textures, and the animals that live there. Kids develop early biology skills as they sort animals by habitat, compare environments, and understand how creatures adapt to survive.

WEEK 8: Weather Wonders: Little Meteorologists at Work

Children become junior weather scientists as they experiment with wind power using fans, streamers, and pinwheels. They create rain bottles, cloud jars, and rainbow spray art while learning how weather forms and changes. Campers practice daily forecasting with a kid-friendly Weather Chart and explore storm patterns through movement games like Lightning Freeze, Thunder Stomp, and Rain Pitter-Patter. Every day is a new weather discovery!

WEEK 9: Transportation City: Engineers On the Move

In this bustling mini-city, children design and build roadways, intersections, and bridges using tape, blocks, and cardboard, then test traffic flow with cars and trucks. Campers explore flight at our "Paper Airplane Airport," measuring distance, angle, and speed in simple STEM challenges. Pretend play expands at our Train Station with tickets, conductors, and destinations, helping students build communication, sequencing, and real-world problem-solving skills.

New Horizons School Summer Camp Policies

Welcome to New Horizons School Summer Camp! Please review the following policies carefully:

1. Holidays: Camp will observe holidays on the following days (no camp):

- Juneteenth: Friday June 19, 2026
- Independence Day: Friday July 03, 2026

These two weeks will have a lower weekly fee of \$300 for Day Camp, and weekly Meals will be \$45. Specialty Camp (optional add-on) and Academic Camp (optional add-on) will continue to be charged \$50 weekly rate.

2. Sibling Discount: 5% of the camp fee for the sibling with the lower amount

3. Registration & Payment: Enrollment is first-come, first-served. Full payment is required before camp begins. No refunds for missed days. Late pick-up incurs a \$5 fee per 5 minutes past pick-up time.

4. Drop-Off & Pick-Up: Drop-off starts at 8:30 AM; pick-up is no later than 5:30 PM. Only authorized individuals may pick up a child. ID may be required.

5. Health & Safety: Sick children must stay home until symptom-free for 24 hours. Parents will be called for pick-up if illness occurs at camp. All allergies must be disclosed. We are a nut-free facility but cannot guarantee an allergen-free environment. Parents must provide medications with a medical authorization form. In emergencies, 911 will be called immediately; parents are responsible for emergency medical costs.

6. Behavior & Conduct: Campers must follow instructions and treat peers and staff with respect. Aggressive/disruptive behavior may result in removal without a refund. Bullying is not tolerated.

7. Meals & Snacks: Parents must provide a packed lunch and two snacks (if not purchasing from the school). Alternatively, hot lunch and snack options are available for purchase at the time of booking for added convenience. Campers must bring a labeled water bottle daily. Please do not send any sodas, candy, or junk food as they will be discarded.

8. Attire & Personal Belongings: Campers must wear comfortable clothing and closed-toe shoes. Sunscreen must be applied before arrival. Electronics, toys, and valuables are not allowed; the school is not responsible for lost items.

9. Field Trips & Outdoor Activities: Parents will receive advance notice of off-campus trips. Field Trips will incur additional charges. Signed permission slips are required.

10. Inclement Weather & Emergencies: Outdoor activities may be moved indoors in extreme weather. Parents will be notified of any schedule changes. Emergency protocols, including shelter-in-place and evacuation, will be followed.

11. Communication & Updates: For urgent matters, contact the school office directly.
